Disclosure of “Net Zero Transition Plan”

Dai-ichi Life Holdings, Inc. hereby releases “Net Zero Transition Plan” (the “transition plan”) which is an action plan intended to promote the transition to a net-zero economy as a whole through investments while also reducing emissions stemming from business activities to net zero.

The transition plan mainly focuses on the activities of Dai-ichi Life Insurance Company (“Dai-ichi Life”), which is the Dai-ichi Life Group (the “Group”)’s core operating entity in Japan, and the transition plan clarifies the Group’s current initiatives, challenges and future plans towards a net-zero economy. The transition plan was developed based on the GFANZ¹ transition-plan framework².

The Group will continue engaging through the transition plan via various initiatives such as:

1. The Group accelerates the activities to reduce GHG emissions, which we have committed;
2. The Group collaborate and cooperate with stakeholders including investees based on effective dialogue by sharing the Group’s approach to achieve a sustainable society with them; and,
3. The Group share the goal to achieve a sustainable society among group employees and take actions with more solidly unite.
